Introduction

In Malaysia, the involvement of the state in everyday life has increased since the New Economic Policy (NEP), generally called the Bumiputra policy, was launched in 1971. This has had far-reaching effects on everyday life, including practices pertaining to births and deaths, meals and clothing, languages and communication, local economic activities such as farming and fishing, and religious beliefs and rituals. All have experienced dynamic changes with implementation of the NEP, not just in the central part of the nation, but also at the "periphery" or in marginal societies.

Bangi Field Station (Bangi FS) was set up at Institut Alam dan Tamadun Melayu (ATMA), Universiti Kebangsaan Malaysia (UKM) in August, 2002 as an locus to provide facilities to students and staff who conduct fieldwork on topics generally concerned with "the dynamics of society–state interactions in Malaysia" and to staff engaged in the on-site education of the students. Moreover, all of its members have sought to promote academic cooperation with ATMA and other Malaysian institutions.

Three graduate students, Ms. Kawano Motoko, Ms. Kato Yuko and Mr. Naito Daisuke at ASAFAS have conducted fieldworks in Malaysia with supports from the Bangi FS and are presently having struggles with Ph. D. dissertations. Activities of Bangi FS also cover organization of seminars/ symposium, "on-site education" and academic cooperation for field research under MOU which was concluded in March, 2006 between CSEAS, ASAFAS and ATMA. Dr. Nagatsu has conducted extensive surveys on the institutionalization of Islam and

subsequent re-orientation of the local concept of religious authority in Malaysia with cooperation of ATMA staff.
